The PRH Cardiac Rehabilitation Program is designed for those with cardiac conditions or those who have had heart surgery or heart catheterization. The individualized, medically supervised program of exercise and education builds a patient's strength and endurance so they may safely and effectively overcome some of the physical complications associated with certain types of heart disease. The multi-step process involves input from an entire team of healthcare professionals based on the needs of the patient.

"The unique aspect of the program is the friendly environment created by staff and patients who make it a comfortable experience for new patients who are anxious about exercise and their recovery," said Alie Hayes, RN, PRH Cardiac Rehab. "True friendships are built here."

Services. "Patients wear a small telemetry unit while exercising and this connects wirelessly to the central station where heart rate and rhythms are displayed."

Up to eight patients may be monitored at once on the new telemetry system. Other information about patients' response to exercise sessions is entered into the system. This helps the care team generate reports about the progress patients make during participation in the program.

"We are so grateful to receive this generous donation to fully fund the monitoring system." said Kristi Line, Executive Director of the PRH Foundation. "FMUB's donation allows us to use additional donations to assist in funding other needs in our heart healthy appeal, such as the three new EKG machines for our Emergency Department, inpatient units, and Respiratory Therapy Department to provide electrocardiograms to monitor heart health and quickly detect heart problems."

"The staff and patients care about one another," she added. "So there is a genuine accountability for people who are having difficulty maintaining their activity level or commitment to the program."

Approximately 180 patients visit the program weekly, with 120 of them requiring monitoring. Patients usually graduate after 3-4 months and have the opportunity to continue to exercise at the facility through the PRH Fitness for Life Program.

A BIT ABOUT ENDOWMENTS

An endowment fund allows a person's gift to be in perpetuity. Financial endowments are typically structured so the principal amount invested remains intact, while investment income is available for immediate funding for use to keep a nonprofit company operating efficiently.

Most large endowments are structured so a portion of the principal is released for use only after a period of time. This delayed use of the donation allows for the donation impact to be extended over a longer period of time while encouraging endowment growth and ensuring that operational needs are covered.

Endowments also may be given with specific uses stated by the donor, further complicating disbursements. Therefore, almost all large endowment funds are professionally managed with clear investment goals.

2022 FUNDRAISING FFFORTS

LUNA INFANT SIMULATOR/NEWBORN RESUSCITATION TRAINING MANNEQUIN

Prairie Ridge Health Foundation is purchasing a \$35,000 CAE Luna Newborn Training Simulator. The OB nurses, obstetricians, CRNAs, House Supervisors, and ER teams will be able to train on a fully interactive, wireless simulator. From newborn assessment and infant CPR to advanced life support and neonatal resuscitation, the Luna baby offers a comprehensive range of features and scenarios.

No other rural facility in our area has a training mannequin at this level, and with PRH having a record number of births last year, the Foundation is excited to provide this state-of-the-art training equipment for the team. This will help us to save the newest of lives.

PULMONARY FUNCTION TESTING EQUIPMENT

Prairie Ridge Health Foundation plans to spend \$58,000 to provide updated Pulmonary Function Testing equipment for our Respiratory Therapy Department. We will fundraise throughout the year and then round out the fundraiser with our Annual Appeal. This new equipment will replace our existing testing equipment that is nearing the end of life.

This equipment is used to measure lung function and provide a full respiratory system analysis. COVID has taken a toll on a lot of people's lungs and long-term effects are still to be seen. The PRH Foundation wants to be a part of ensuring we have the best testing equipment available for the patients we serve.
