PRH Volunteers create healthcare career endowment

The Volunteers of Prairie Ridge Health (PRH) donated \$100,000 to the PRH Foundation on May 15 to establish a healthcare career scholarship endowment for high school students in the hospital's service area who are pursuing a health career.

Each year the Volunteers of PRH Scholarship Committee, consisting of five active members of the Volunteers of PRH, awards up to eight \$1,000 scholarships to graduating seniors in 10 school districts throughout the hospital's service area. The Volunteers of PRH formed the endowment to allow the principle to live on perpetually and generate income to continue providing scholarships for years to come.

"Partnering with the Volunteers allows a multifaceted approach to scholarships. The Volunteers have successfully been raising funds and awarding scholarships for over 35 years, while the Foundation has successfully invested and managed endowment funds since 1999," said Kristi Line, PRH Executive Director of Foundation and Volunteer Services. "The Foundation Finance Committee and the Volunteers Scholarship Committee will be able to work together using their respectful expertise to continue offering scholarships indefinitely and support the future healthcare workforce that serves our communities and beyond."

Students attending high school in the communities of Columbus, Fall River, Rio, Randolph, Cambria-Friesland, Waterloo, Sun Prairie, Marshall, Beaver Dam, and Pardeeville are eligible to apply for the scholarship. The number of scholarships awarded is based on the receipt of applications from qualified applicants.

"A scholarship program empowers the communities we serve by cultivating a new generation of healthcare professionals who are dedicated to improving rural healthcare," said Line. "By investing in their education, we ensure these talented individuals can bring essential medical services to underserved areas, enhancing the overall health and well-being of rural populations."

Prairie Ridge Health's new Sun Prairie clinic is conveniently located near Highway 151 for easy patient access and, beginning in October, will be open Monday – Friday from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. with expanded hours for rehabilitation services appointments.

"We have made a conscious decision to invest in the growth of our clinics to help meet the needs of the communities we serve, including the new Sun Prairie location" says John Russell, President and CEO of Prairie Ridge Health.

"The look and feel of the Sun Prairie clinic will be very similar to our hospital and clinics," says Hannah Young, Director of Clinic Operations. "Every aspect of the facility has been carefully crafted with the patient experience in mind. The clinic has a warm and open design, offering an inviting experience for patients."

A ribbon cutting ceremony and community open house will be held in October.

The one-story 23,000 square-foot clinic will be the home to providers offering Family Medicine, Integrative Health, Orthopedics, OB/GYN, Dermatology, Allergy and Immunology, General Surgery, Psychiatry, Nutrition Services and Diabetes Education, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, and other ancillary services.

The space will include a full-size gym for physical and occupational therapy. Construction will continue through the summer with a grand opening set for October of 2024. A community open house will be announced as the opening date approaches. We look forward to becoming a part of the Sun Prairie community. With the addition of the Sun Prairie Clinic, we will have four convenient locations including Beaver Dam, Columbus and Marshall.

In March, we celebrated the retirement of Dr. Bruce Kraus, who served the community and Prairie Ridge Health for approximately 46 years. Getting patients back to doing what they love is at the heart of Dr. Albert Cecchini's sports medicine and orthopedics practice.

"I enjoy working with patients and including them in the decision-making process in order to better understand their goals and expectations of treatment."

Dr. Cecchini grew up in southern New Jersey about 20 minutes away from Philadelphia. While in college he became interested in orthopedics and sports medicine and completed his fellowship in 2001.

He reminds us that sports medicine isn't just for young athletes. "I prefer not to say that I'm a sports guy. "Protocols have improved and are better. Surgeries have evolved and we now offer a lot of minimally invasive surgeries and procedures. Sharing of information has changed as well. There is more access to information for patients. Years ago, you went to the doctor, they told you what to do and that's what you did. Now the patient and I work together to come up with a treatment plan that suits their lifestyle. I see patients of all ages from elementary school and middle school age to older adults."

Eligible recipients must be entering a human health-oriented career program of not less than two years at an accredited school (this includes, but is not limited to, careers in nursing, medical coding and transcription, laboratory, psychology, pre-med, medical imaging, pharmacy, nutrition, physical therapy, respiratory therapy, mental health, and more). Other deciding factors in determining the scholarship recipients include character, initiative, participation in extracurricular activities, and/or work experience. Scholarships winners are announced each spring.

The PRH Foundation currently oversees four scholarship opportunities: 1) the newly established Volunteers of PRH Healthcare Careers Scholarship Endowment, 2) the Ruth Kohlwey Memorial Nursing Scholarship, which is an internal nursing scholarship for PRH team members who are obtaining or extending their nursing degree, 3) the Amanda Murphy Memorial Scholarship, established in 2023 in memory of Amanda, a PRH ER nurse who lost her life to COVID. This scholarship is awarded annually to dependents of PRH team members who are obtaining a degree in a clinical healthcare field, and finally 4) the F.A. & Nina I. Stare Nursing Scholarship (the Foundation is the operating trustee), which is awarded annually to a maximum of three Columbus High School seniors who plan to obtain a nursing degree and practice in a rural setting.

Dr. Laura Clifton grew up in Chicago and received her BA from Boston University in Massachusetts and her MD from the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee, where she completed her residency in Dermatology.

AAD encourages self-skin exams

According to the American Academy of Dermatology Association, skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States; in fact, 1 in 5 Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime. People of all colors and races can get skin cancer. With early detection and proper treatment, the cure rate for basal cell carcinoma (BCC) and squamous cell carcinoma (SCC) is about 95 percent. When melanoma is detected before it spreads, it also has a high cure rate. Regular self-skin exams and regular examinations by a dermatologist help people find early skin cancers.

The AAD encourages everyone to take steps to prevent skin cancer and detect it early, when it’s most treatable. Men over 50 have an increased risk of developing melanoma compared to the general population, according to the AAD.

If you notice any suspicious spots on your skin or your partner’s skin, or anything that is changing, itching or bleeding, see a board-certified dermatologist.

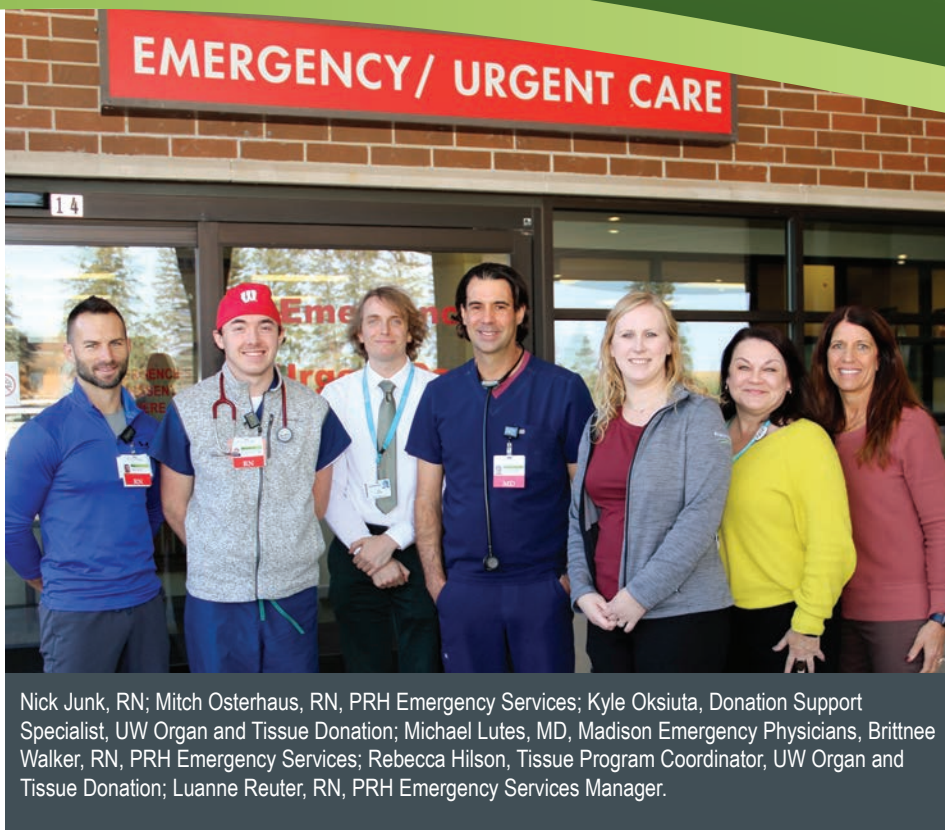
Care beyond words

One family's story of organ donation

According to statistics, more than 100,000 people are waiting for lifesaving organ transplants and every nine minutes another person is added to the waiting list. Of those waiting, 17 people die each day because the organs they need are not donated in time. Through the collaboration of the PRH Emergency Services team and UW's Organ and Tissue Donation Center, two of those lives were saved through organ donation in 2023.

"Our day with this patient began with a call from registration alerting us of a patient who was unresponsive and needed assistance getting out of a vehicle," said Mitch Osterhaus, RN, Emergency Services at PRH. "We brought the patient back to the ER to begin her care."

"We got vital signs right away and started working on getting both an IV and then intubated her," said Brittnee Walker, RN, Emergency Services at PRH. "We then took a CT scan."

"When the head CT came back, it was clear that there was a large intercranial bleed, which in this patient's case, was an irreversible cause of death," said Mitch.

Michael Lutes, MD, Emergency Medicine and Nick Junk, RN, recognized that the patient could be an organ donor and directed the PRH care team to contact UW Health Organ and Tissue Donation. The team connected with Kyle Oksiuta, Donation Support Specialist at UW-Health Organ and Tissue Donation.

"We were very fortunate to work with Kyle, the representative from the UW's organ procurement team, and he, from all accounts, did a fantastic job of situating the family at the center of these conversations about organ donation," said Mitch. "He did so in a way that was very understandable and very sensitive to the raw emotions of the family's situation."

"From the moment I walked in, everyone from the registrars to the physicians (at PRH) were super nice and receptive. It was a pinnacle experience for me to see such support from everyone at the hospital," said Kyle. "Studies show that loved ones are more likely to say yes to organ donation because of the care they received. The conversation with this family went so easily because of the care they felt. My job was really easy that day, because the staff was phenomenal, and the family was phenomenal."

Brittnee, who was also a close friend of the family, stayed with the family throughout the patient's care. "Kyle talked with the family about the possibility of organ donation, and they felt it was the right thing to do, so we continued with the process," said Brittnee. "From registration to our physician to our nursing staff, medical imaging, lab, and respiratory therapist, all of them together is what made everything go well."

One of the things that our team here at Prairie Ridge does really well is putting the patient and their family first, within all of our care decisions and conversations," said Mitch. "In this case, we were very lucky that we had Brittnee on that day. I think we're very lucky here in Columbus to have a hospital equipped with the resources and the caring hearts that make these difficult moments ideally into ones with silver linings for the family."

"Because of her, we know that two lives were saved," said Brittnee.

UW Organ and Tissue Donation (UW OTD) is one of 57 federally designated, not-for-profit organ procurement organizations in the nation. According to UW Health Organ and Tissue Donation, more than 42,000 organ transplants from 21,300 donors brought new life to patients and their families in 2022. Organs that can be transplanted include the heart, liver, lungs, kidneys, pancreas and intestine.

Who gets my assets if I die without a Will or Trust?

If you die without estate planning documents such as a will or trust in place, Wisconsin's laws of intestate succession will determine who receives your assets through the probate process, and in what percentage. Generally speaking, the "who" includes your closest living relatives.

There is a perception that the government ends up with your money either through taxes or seizure. The estate tax level is currently \$13.61m per person, so it is rarely imposed. While the probate court does require a filing fee of .2% of the value of assets subject to the probate administration, the government does not end up with your money except in extremely rare cases where no relatives can be located.
