Throughout this time we prepared our organization for the day a vaccine was available by purchasing ultra-cold storage, securing an area for the vaccine clinic, and allocating team members to run it. On December 16, we received our first 100 doses of vaccine and vaccinated our first team member and have since vaccinated over 2,000 community members.

Over the past 12 months, our team at Prairie Ridge Health has remained focused through each and every challenge presented by COVID-19. From the early stages of diagnosis, to the unchartered course of treatment, and now to the duty of vaccinating our communities.

Thank you for supporting us and the entire Prairie Ridge Health team as we navigate through this unprecedented time together.

On December 11, 2020, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine in persons aged 16 years and older for prevention of COVID-19.

December 14, PRH announced as an approved vaccination site, has ultra-cold storage, and plans in place to vaccinate the team and public.







Construction of a three-story clinic building and rehabilitation space on the Park Avenue campus was completed in October of 2020. The new space features natural light and an open atmosphere, promoting healing and wellness. The expansion was made possible by the overwhelming support of community members who donated \$218,000 to furnish the therapy and cardiac rehab gyms with new equipment and furnishings.

The clinic building's third floor is home to physical, occupational, and speech therapy services with a dedicated registration and scheduling team for your convenience. Cardiac rehabilitation services now has a dedicated area in the former rehabilitation services space on the hospital's first floor. The first floor of the clinic building is the home of Prairie Ridge Health's Family Practice and Internal Medicine providers. PRH Orthopedic, General Surgery, Rheumatology and OBGYN specialties remain across the hall in the original clinic.

Since 2014, the clinics have grown to three locations (Columbus, Beaver Dam and Marshall), which are the home of 17 providers offering 12 different service lines including: Orthopedics, General Surgery, OB/GYN, Rheumatology, Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Clinical Nutrition and Diabetes Services, Medical Imaging, Physical and Occupational Therapy, and Lab.



The new Beaver Dam clinic will be built on land acquired just off of Hwy 151, located near Exit 134, approaching East Industrial Drive.

Architectural design is being completed by Eppstein Uhen Architects. Projected completion of the building is January 2022; however the project timeline is ultimately dependent on the supply chain.

Our Beaver Dam clinic offers Family Medicine, General Surgery, Clinical Nutrition and Diabetes Services, Orthopedics, and Physical and Occupational Therapy. The new building will allow for additional providers, as well as increased patient volume. The Ridge Cafe, located on the hospital's ground floor, features a spacious dining area, made-to order sandwiches and curbside delivery, as well as outdoor patio seating

during the spring, summer and fall.

in a healthy future

Prairie Ridge Health, Inc. entered 2020 with a solid financial position which enabled us to withstand the financial challenges that the COVID-19 pandemic brought to us over the year. Total revenues were 8.2% lower than planned due to the postponement of non-essential procedures from mid-March until mid-May. Total expenses were favorable to budget by 4.4%. This was primarily due to discretionary expenses that were budgeted but not incurred during the pandemic. Consequently, income from operations was 83.2% below plan for the year.


While 2020 looked very different from past years financially, there are some positive indicators which point to our

continued strong financial position. One is that after being 8.2% under budget in revenue, we still ended the year with a positive income from operations or operating gain. Another example is that our balance sheet continues to reflect our ability to weather the economic uncertainty that has accompanied this time. Throughout the pandemic, and times of fluctuating volumes and revenues, we have managed our expenses while still providing high quality, low-cost care for those in our service area.

Although this past year has brought its challenges, we remain grateful for the continued support from the communities we serve. Adapting to a new world

On March 13, 2020, in response to the potential spread of COVID-19, the Volunteers of PRH took a leave of absence from volunteering onsite at Prairie Ridge Health.

Communication became priority. The Volunteers of PRH Board of Directors took on the task of individually calling each volunteer for wellness checks. Through these quarterly efforts, the volunteer organization stayed up to date on both the physical and mental wellbeing of the volunteers.

Volunteer fundraising efforts came to a halt and those volunteers chairing committees began researching alternative ways to continue to generate funds for needed equipment and services for Prairie Ridge Health. Virtual sales, Facebook Live, and conference calls became a part of an organization that had in the past relied on face-to-face interactions.

The group held seven successful virtual and pre-order only sales from May thru December 2020, with their first being a flower sale for Prairie Ridge Health team members and volunteers only. On June 15, 12 volunteers returned to assist as greeters at the hospital's main entrance. In August the volunteers opened the Gift Shoppe for limited hours four days a week. The shop is available for PRH team members and patients only in order to provide a safe environment for the healthcare team and patients.

The Volunteers of PRH ended 2020 by marking their 36th annual Lights of Love as a virtual event on Facebook Live. The event generated over \$5,000 to be donated to the PRH Lifeline Program (a home emergency response system which enables elderly, handicapped, or medically-fragile persons to live independently) and the PRH Hunger Care Program (a food distribution program which provides heart healthy and diabetes-friendly food for food insecure individuals in the hospital's service area.


