

Our strong financial position allowed us to make the decision early on to postpone non-essential visits and procedures in order to protect our community, healthcare team, and patients. Many of our team members embraced new roles in the organization – screening patients, monitoring doors, answering calls for our triage line, and performing COVID-19 testing. The days, weeks and months passed, and our team remained committed, kind and flexible, even when pressed uncomfortably forward.

We watched as the positive cases in Wisconsin surged and cared for our community members who were affected by the virus. Throughout this time we prepared our organization for the day a vaccine was available by purchasing ultra-cold storage, securing an area for the vaccine clinic, and allocating team members to run it. On December 16, we received our first 100 doses of vaccine and vaccinated our first team member and have since vaccinated over 2,000 community members.

Over the past 12 months, our team at Prairie Ridge Health has remained focused through each and every challenge presented by COVID-19. From the early stages of diagnosis, to the uncharted course of treatment, and now to the duty of vaccinating our communities.

Thank you for supporting us and the entire Prairie Ridge Health team as we navigate through this unprecedented time together.

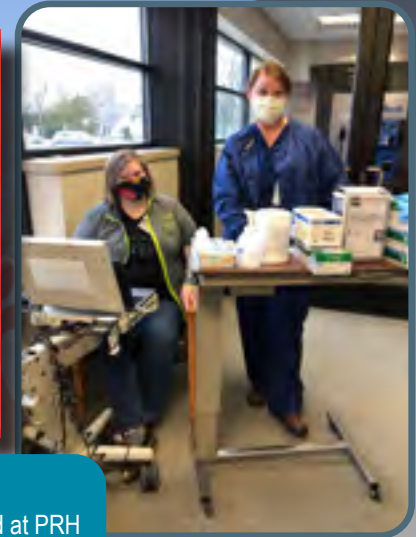

March 19

Community Resources Program launched at PRH for individuals unable to obtain essential supplies due to shortages or financial constraints.

Prairie Ridge Health postponed all non-essential procedures, non-urgent clinic visits, and classes indefinitely. Volunteering, job shadows, student rotations suspended. Visitors restricted.

Area school districts close indefinitely.

Outdoor COVID-19 testing site opened Mon-Fri 10 am - 2 pm for those with a physician's order and scheduled appointment.

PRH temporarily replaces Urgent Care with a Walk-In Clinic to provide non-emergent services to patients without an appointment in a safe space.

Four COVID-19 cases confirmed in Columbia County.

March 14, 2020

Operational Command Team formed. Begins meeting daily.

March 15

Main and ER entrances staffed to monitor patients for COVID-19 symptoms. Other entrances closed.

March 16

24/7 Emergency Services continue. Walk-In Clinic open 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. 7 days a week.

March 18

All team members required to monitor temperature and symptoms.

March 19

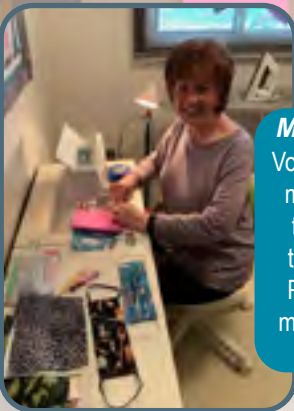


PRH team members participate in drills and education to prepare for COVID-19 positive patients.



March 21

Volunteers of PRH and other local sewers organize to make masks for PRH employees to conserve PPE. Non-clinical team members begin wearing cloth masks. Patient care team wear CDC approved PPE when caring for patients. Patients and visitors entering the hospital are given cloth masks. In total, volunteer sewers donated over 4,000 cloth masks to PRH.



All patients directed to ER entrance and screened at remote site in parking lot.

Gov. Tony Evers issues Safer At Home Order.

WI reported 585 positive tests with 5 in Columbia County, 3 in Dodge and 88 in Dane - Columbia and Dane counties identified as community spread 6 deaths with 1 death in Dane County.

First confirmed COVID-19 patient at PRH. WI reported 842 positive tests with 6 in Columbia County, 6 in Dodge and 133 in Dane; 13 deaths with 1 in Dane County.

PRH expands telemedicine services to include Diabetes Education and Nutrition Services.

March 23

Screening trailer staffed by Registered Nurses.

March 24

No visitors allowed except for end of life, childbirth deliveries, pediatric patients.

March 25

CMS broadens telehealth access. PRH implements Google Duo for telemonitoring & telemedicine.

March 26

Patients with symptoms encouraged to use phone triage at PRH Clinic.

April 8

WI reported: 95 deaths with 1 in Columbia, 11 in Dane.

PRH receives 2,500 pieces of PPE from the national stockpile including masks, face shields, and gowns. Community members and businesses donate PPE to assist the patient care team.

In-house testing and processing capability up and running in PRH Lab.

Gov. Tony Evers announces Badger Bounce Back Program to slowly open WI.

PRH hosts Occupational Health COVID-19 webinar for Occupational Health business partners from service area regarding importance of keeping the workplace safe and mitigating for a potential outbreak of COVID-19.

PRH main entrance reopens for clinic or scheduled outpatient appointments. All patients screened at trailer in parking lot prior to entry.

PRH Clinic - Beaver Dam reopens. 247 Urgent Care Services resume. Walk-In Clinic closes.

All Prairie Ridge Health services resumed, including Cardiac Rehab with restrictions. Services operating in a limited capacity to ensure patients are not in waiting areas and to allow for enhanced cleaning measures between appointments.

Gov. Tony Evers issues state-wide mask mandate.

Gov. Tony Evers extends mask mandate until Nov. 21 due to surge in cases.

PRH encourages self-tracing for positive cases.

June 15

WI reported: 3,061 (13%) COVID hospitalizations 694 deaths.

July 6

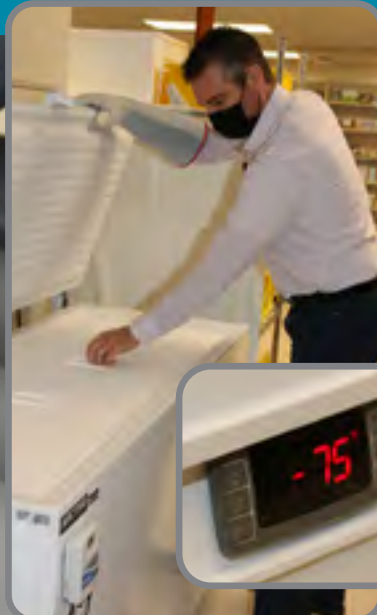

On December 11, 2020, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine in persons aged 16 years and older for prevention of COVID-19.

December 14, PRH announced as an approved vaccination site, has ultra-cold storage, and plans in place to vaccinate the team and public.

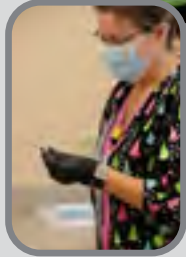

forward for better patient care

Construction of a three-story clinic building and rehabilitation space on the Park Avenue campus was completed in October of 2020. The new space features natural light and an open atmosphere, promoting healing and wellness. The expansion was made possible by the overwhelming support of community members who donated \$218,000 to furnish the therapy and cardiac rehab gyms with new equipment and furnishings.

The clinic building's third floor is home to physical, occupational, and speech therapy services with a dedicated registration and scheduling team for your convenience. Cardiac rehabilitation services now has a dedicated area in the former rehabilitation services space on the hospital's first floor. The first floor of the clinic building is the home of Prairie Ridge Health's Family Practice and Internal Medicine providers. PRH Orthopedic, General Surgery, Rheumatology and OBGYN specialties remain across the hall in the original clinic.

Since 2014, the clinics have grown to three locations (Columbus, Beaver Dam and Marshall), which are the home of 17 providers offering 12 different service lines including: Orthopedics, General Surgery, OB/GYN, Rheumatology, Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Clinical Nutrition and Diabetes Services, Medical Imaging, Physical and Occupational Therapy, and Lab.

The Ridge Cafe, located on the hospital's ground floor, features a spacious dining area, made-to order sandwiches and curbside delivery, as well as outdoor patio seating during the spring, summer and fall.

Building to serve our communities

The new Beaver Dam clinic will be built on land acquired just off of Hwy 151, located near Exit 134, approaching East Industrial Drive.

Architectural design is being completed by Eppstein Uhen Architects. Projected completion of the building is January 2022; however the project timeline is ultimately dependent on the supply chain.

Our Beaver Dam clinic offers Family Medicine, General Surgery, Clinical Nutrition and Diabetes Services, Orthopedics, and Physical and Occupational Therapy. The new building will allow for additional providers, as well as increased patient volume.

Expansion of our Prairie Ridge Health Clinic in Beaver Dam was paused in April 2020 due to unknowns related to the pandemic. The project will move forward with a groundbreaking in April 2021.

Investing

in a healthy future

Prairie Ridge Health, Inc. entered 2020 with a solid financial position which enabled us to withstand the financial challenges that the COVID-19 pandemic brought to us over the year. Total revenues were 8.2% lower than planned due to the postponement of non-essential procedures from mid-March until mid-May. Total expenses were favorable to budget by 4.4%. This was primarily due to discretionary expenses that were budgeted but not incurred during the pandemic. Consequently, income from operations was 83.2% below plan for the year.

While 2020 looked very different from past years financially, there are some positive indicators which point to our

continued strong financial position. One is that after being 8.2% under budget in revenue, we still ended the year with a positive income from operations or operating gain. Another example is that our balance sheet continues to reflect our ability to weather the economic uncertainty that has accompanied this time. Throughout the pandemic, and times of fluctuating volumes and revenues, we have managed our expenses while still providing high quality, low-cost care for those in our service area.

Although this past year has brought its challenges, we remain grateful for the continued support from the communities we serve. Thank you for entrusting us with the stewardship of our resources to continue living out our mission: By building caring relationships with those we serve, we guide the journey to health and wellness.

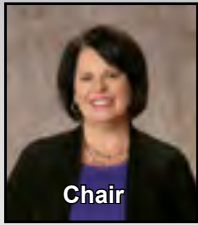

This year, PRH Foundation donations have made the following possible:

- **Portable Ultrasound** for the Emergency Department. To aid in diagnosing patients without moving the patient from their room.
- **Donor Milk Refrigerator** for the Childbirth Services Department. To store donated breast milk for newborns.
- **Miscarriage Kits** for Perinatal Loss Program. To provide care and compassion for those who suffered loss due to a miscarriage.
- **CuddleCot Cooling Bed*** for Perinatal Loss Program. To provide the time needed for parents to grieve immediately following a perinatal loss.
- **Cooler Backpacks** for Cancer Navigation Program Patients. To provide a convenient bag for necessities during treatments.

- **Fabric Masks** for Walk In Wednesday mammogram patients.
- **Pediatric Crash Cart*** for Emergency Department. To house all critical supplies needed when responding to pediatric emergencies.
- **Dry Bath*** for Laboratory Services. To warm blood bank tubes during testing and ensure precise temperature control.
- **Fetal Monitoring & Labor Progress Model*** for Childbirth Services. A realistic simulation of labor assessment to help train nurses on labor progression.
- **Troop Elevation Pillow System*** for Anesthesia. To assist with airway management during both sedation and intubation.
- **Wig Program** for Cancer Navigation Program. To provide wigs for patients undergoing cancer treatment.
- **Mammography & Biopsy After Care Kits** with help from our local high school volleyball, football, and basketball teams.
- **Nursing Scholarships** for employees and high school students entering or furthering a nursing career.
- **Emergency Patient Assistance Funds** to assist patients with emergent needs, such as transportation, clothing, etc.

PRH Foundation endowments: general endowment, women's health endowment, infrastructure and equipment endowment, and community education endowment.

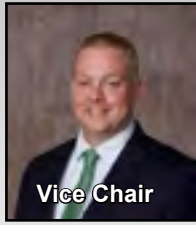

Adapting to a new world

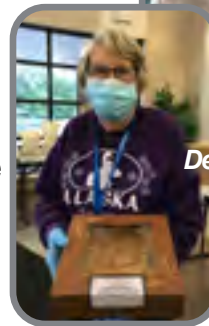
On March 13, 2020, in response to the potential spread of COVID-19, the Volunteers of PRH took a leave of absence from volunteering onsite at Prairie Ridge Health.

Communication became priority. The Volunteers of PRH Board of Directors took on the task of individually calling each volunteer for wellness checks. Through these quarterly efforts, the volunteer organization stayed up to date on both the physical and mental wellbeing of the volunteers.

Volunteer fundraising efforts came to a halt and those volunteers chairing committees began researching alternative ways to continue to generate funds for needed equipment and services for Prairie Ridge Health. Virtual sales, Facebook Live, and conference calls became a part of an organization that had in the past relied on face-to-face interactions.

The group held seven successful virtual and pre-order only sales from May thru December 2020, with their first being a flower sale for Prairie Ridge Health team members and volunteers only. On June 15, 12 volunteers returned to assist as greeters at the hospital's main entrance. In August the volunteers opened the Gift Shoppe for limited hours four days a week. The shop is available for PRH team members and patients only in order to provide a safe environment for the healthcare team and patients.

The Volunteers of PRH ended 2020 by marking their 36th annual Lights of Love as a virtual event on Facebook Live. The event generated over \$5,000 to be donated to the PRH Lifeline Program (a home emergency response system which enables elderly, handicapped, or medically-fragile persons to live independently) and the PRH Hunger Care Program (a food distribution program which provides heart healthy and diabetes-friendly food for food insecure individuals in the hospital's service area).

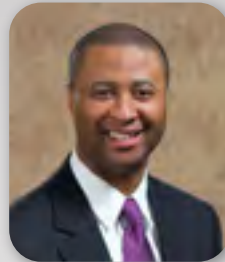
